About the Speakers

<u>Carlos Alberto Sintado</u> graduated from the Union Theological Seminary of Buenos Aires in Argentina, after studying philosophy as well as theology, and was awarded a Ph.D. by Drew University in Madison, USA. Sintado served as an ordained minister of the Evangelical Methodist Church of Argentina, was General Secretary of the Latin American Union of Ecumenical Youth, Executive Secretary of the Latin American Ecumenical Coordination, and Director of the Cordoba Ecumenical Centre, before joining the Headquarters of the WCC.

<u>Frédéric-Paul Piguet</u> mène une recherche exigeante en écologie morale et politique depuis une vingtaine d'années.
